Distance: Training and assessment materials provided for completion within negotiated timeframe and followed up by third party reporting and on the job observations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

The entry requirement for this qualification is TLI21915 Certificate II in Track Protection or relevant industry experience gained by working in the rail infrastructure environment providing track protection services.

TIME VARIATIONS:

- Individual assessments (LLN)
- The number of hours worked (which will alter how long it will take to get log book hours)
- State Industry requirements
- Experience levels of the learner

TYPE OF ASSESSMENT: Written knowledge assessment, practical observations, scenario based practical tasks, log book, portfolio of evidence, third party reports

STANDARD OF DRESS: Suitable work clothing required when conducting training activities. A minimum of high visibility long sleeved shirt with long pants and closed in steel cap footwear.

PRACTICAL TRAINING: 30 days of mentoring in the field prior to sign off on practical assessment by appointed workplace supervisors.

NATIONALLY ACCREDITED:

Participants who meet the requirement of the accredited training and assessment may be issued with either a Qualification or a Statement of Attainment. Both documents will be clearly identified with the Nationally Recognised Training Logo.
